The October Minutes were accepted as printed without change.







THE SIDEWALL STORY

A lot can be learned by reading the tire's sidewall. Illustrations Nos. 1 and 2 show the following typical information on the sidewall of passenger car and light truck tires.

"P205/60HR15 90H" Size marking and Service Description (load index, speed symbol) for a P-Metric speed rated passenger tire.

"Radial" Every radial construction tire must show the word "radial" on the sidewall.

"Max. Load 590 kg (1301 lbs.) @ 240 kPa (35 psi) maximum pressure" Indicates load limits and associated maximum cold inflation. P-Metric sidewall markings are given in both metric and English units. For normal operation, follow pressure recommendations in owner's manual or on vehicle tire information placard.

"Tread 4 Plies ..." 4 plies under tread (2 xxxx cord + 2 xxxx cord), Sidewall 2 plies xxxx cord. Indicates tire ply composition and materials used.

"DOT xxxx xxxxxx" The "DOT" symbol certifies tire manufacturer's compliance with Department of Transportation tire safety standards. Next to this is the tire identification or "serial number." The last three characters are numbers identifying the week and year of manufacture. (Example: "026" means second week of 1986, "374" means thirty-seventh week of 1984, etc.) Other characters are the manufacturer's coding for size/type and plant of manufacture.

"Tubeless" The tire must be marked either "tubeless" or "tube-type."

"M+S" Any combination of the letters M and S indicates the tire meets the Rubber Manufacturers Association (RMA) definition for a snow tire.

TRACTION B TEMPERA-"TREADWEAR 160 TURE A" Quality grades are required to be established by tire manufacturers according to regulations of the Department of Transportation (DOT). The Federal Government Uniform Tire Quality Grading Standard applies to passenger tires only, but excludes deep tread, winter type snow tires, temporary use spare tires, tires with norminal rim diameters of twelve inches or less, and certain older tire types. Tires subject to the standard are required to be graded on the performance factors of treadwear, traction, and temperature. The grades are moided on the tire sidewall and also shown on a label on the tread. See page 12 for a description of the DOT grades.

Illustration No. 2 depicts the following typical information on the sidewall of a light truck tire:

"LT235/85R16" is the size designation for a metric light truck tire.


"LOAD RANGE D" identifies the load and inflation limits.

RADIAL identifies that the tire has a radial construction.

"MAX LOAD SINGLE 2623 lbs AT 65 psi COLD" indicates the maximum load rating of the tire and corresponding minimum cold inflation pressure for that load when used as a single. For normal operation, follow pressure recommendations in owner's manual or on vehicle placard.

"MAX LOAD DUAL 2381 lbs AT 65 psi COLD" indicates the maximum load rating of the tire and corresponding minimum cold inflation pressure when used in a dual configuration.

The other markings on the sidewall have the same meaning as described for the passenger car tire.

<u>Technical tip:</u> A little while ago I had a problem with the charging system of my 280ZX. After suspecting the battery and cleaning the cables from the battery to the Solenoid and Ground, I suspected the problem was related to the alternator. The real problem turned out to be the connections to the Alternator, specifically, the "L/S" push-on connector. After a good cleaning of all connections to the Alternator I have had no charging problems in two months.

Air Conditioning: An article in Mustang Monthly, December, 1993 issue, describes retrofitting an air conditioner into an early Mustang. The significant point for Z owners is the compressor they used is designed for R-134A refrigerant. This refrigerant is being designed into new cars today, as the familiar R-12 (Freon) refrigerant is being outlawed and phased out of manufacture and supply. The R-134A compressors, condenser, lines and evaporator parts needed to update an R-12 system are sold by: Vintage Air, Dept. MM, 110305 I.H.35 North, San Antonio, TX, 78233 (phone 210-654-7171 or 1-800-TO-COOL-U). I don't know if they make bolt-in systems for Z-Cars, but maybe if enough people ask for it they will.
