<u>Last Months Fun Stuff</u>

<u>December meeting at the Automotive Museum</u> - The December 5 meeting was held at the San Diego Automotive Museum, our host was Sandy: Sanford, officially the Director of volunteers for the Museum. Sandys job is to recruit and coordinate the efforts of volunteers donating their time to work on the Automotive Museum displays and the cars themselves. If you have some free time and love to work on cars or can offer a valuable service to the Museum, such as carpentry, painting, electrical, call the Museum and ask to talk to Sandy, he will welcome your call. Naturally, we went to see the cars, and cars there were!! The Museum is showing French cars from the 1930s at the moment. My personal favorite is the Talbot Lago - I never thought I would get to see one in person. There are other Talbots, and Delages, also incredibly beautiful. Also interesting is a display depicting a typical drive up burger joint of the fiftys with a Studebaker, Hudson, 57 T-Bird and a customized Hudson. Although these cars are on loan, the museum has a worthy collection of its own - the De Lorean, Mercedes 300 SL Gullwing, Countach, AMX III (the only one in existance!) and the perennial favorite Tucker (one of only 51 built). The standard collection of Deusenbergs, Franklins, Mustangs, etc. rounds out an incredible display. The Dreadmobile driven by Jack Lemon and Peter Falk in <u>The Great Race</u> was also there (did you know it has a Corvair engine?). The Museum also has several engines on display.

including a twin cam FORD Indy engine, Olds Quad four and an Offy Indy. The Museum is well worth a trip, and joining cost only \$15 a year for unlimited admittance and use of the library. The Museum didnt have any Z Cars on display, but then, none of us wanted to give up our cars!?

December 5 meeting - at the San Diego Automotive Museum


December 17 - Third annual Toy Drive for Children's Hospital, Christmas Party and Christmas light tour.



Tech Tip: A better hood prop by Ben Pila Jr.

If you own a 1984-88 300ZX, then you may have old now weak hood support struts. After time, these struts leak out the high pressure gas that gave them the strength to support your hood in the open position. Here's a fix that works, is easy to fabricate and is very inexpensive. Take a piece of 1/2" PVC pipe (sprinkler pipe) and cut it to the length of the shaft of the hood strut when the hood is open, this should be 5". Then cut a lengthwise section out of the pipe; this section should be slightly wider than the shaft of the hood strut. The finished support "wedge" should now slip over the hood support strut shaft and keep your hood up.
