

This article begins my commitment to do articles of a technical nature for this newsletter. My feelings about writing articles are that not many are written and there are a lot of subjects to write about. I decided – *Caravaning*, *How Is It Done?*

This article begins my commitment to do articles of a technical nature for this newsletter. My feelings about writing articles are that not many are written and there are a lot of subjects to write about. I decided to write about caravaning first due to problems I noticed on our recent run to

Nissan HQ. My hopes are that this writing will open some eyes and bring awareness to what is going on when caravaning.

What we are trying to do with our driving together to events is to get from point A to point B as a group and have fun too. This includes helping anyone who has a problem with their cars and looking good as a club to the public while in caravan form. The problems I've seen most have been following too closely, abrupt stops, abrupt acceleration, last minute lane changes or exits, other caravaners cutting in close or cutting off other traffic, and lack of good communication on the CB.

The solutions are simple. Have a game plan before the caravan begins. Designate a caravan leader. This person is the pace car or the locomotive and has the biggest job. This person will maintain a steady, smooth pace as we drive and any change in speed will take place as smooth as possible. The reason for this is the last person in the group (the express) has to depend on these in force of the person in the the group (the caboose), has to depend on those in front of him to keep pace. Any abrupt speed changes up front cause a major change in the rear. All those in the caravan need to keep a safe following distance behind each other and be attentive to what is going on around them. If the lead car changes speed, try to do so smoothly too. When changing lanes to pass, no need to floor it to get back, just take it easy (unless we're on a back roads, twisty run.) The lead driver has to let everyone know via the CB what's going on up front that is of importance. Chatter such as "We're slowing," or "We're getting off

at the next exit." are very important. Those in the middle should repeat those comments so others will hear. When we are caravaning, we are really having a parade. So, drive like you're in a parade and we'll look good. Don't forget to buy your magnetic door signs from Ed so our caravan looks cool and together.

Z Caravaning, How is It Done? When someone has trouble, we as a group need to pull over and help out. But, don't slam on the brakes and pull hard right. This is dangerous. Just gradually move to the right as the lead car slows us to a SAFE spot to pull over. A safe spot is one that can accommodate all the cars in the caravan and doesn't interfere with traffic in any way. One of the

pluses of caravaning is helping each other if there are problems. The last car in the group should tell the group and the leader of anyone with problems ASAP.

One thing to be aware of on surface streets is what to do when lights change and part of the group is stuck. Ideally, the group that made the light needs to pull over and wait for the other group to rejoin. If necessary, the front group may have to pull in a parking lot or onto a side street. Stay in touch on the CB until the group is back together. When parking as a group, let's keep the uniformity and if the leader backs in first, everyone else should too.

When there is a lot of traffic, we should keep the "Jibber/Jabber" down on the CB so we can hear caravan info. In conclusion try to drive smooth and follow the leader, let's look good as a club! Now if we're on a back roads run, most of the staying together stuff is out the window but try anyway. Anyone have any idea or comments, write a letter to the editor. I'm sure there are other things I'm forgetting.

Those of us who participated in Nissan's 25th anniversary celebration on may 3rd could only anticipate what Nissan had in store for us. Seven hearty souls in freshly prepped Zs, braved the early morning elements and left San Diego at 6:30 for Los Angeles. This to participate in a Nissan Corporate Office hosted event to commemorate the unveiling of ten totally factory restored 240 Zs. These are the first of many to be sold throughout the United States in a unique Nissan marketing strategy.

Some two hours later seven more of us headed north and the only thing we braved was a little traffic. By the time we arrived the Corporate parking lot was filled with over 300 Zs representing every model built as well as Datsun Fairladys and 510s. Racing versions were displayed along with complete restorations. In addition to club member Ed Peterson's "Ferrari Z" was a Cobra styled "Tomahawk Z"- both causing quite a stir. Some came from as far away as Nevada and Texas. New Mexico made their presence known by setting up a booth to advertise their hosting of the Z convention in 1998. A bust of Sky Rat (the ill fated bird in the Nissan commercials) was prominently displayed and the woman in the booth stated it was by far the "peoples choice".

For some of us a poker run, like no other, was next on the docket. Two groups of approximately 60 cars each, left the parking lot in a very organized fashion. One group headed north to Performance Nissan in Hollywood and the other group set out for Universal Nissan in Long Beach. Each group was immediately joined by a squad of uniformed escort officers and as we departed we found ourselves being covered by what appeared to be the Japanese media. Overhead was


