

Meeting Minutes


August 5, 1997



Tech Articles

Correction to last month's tech article:

I said you can use the Toyota 4 piston calipers from 1979-85 Toyota Trucks 2 or 4wd. Only 4WD will work, the 2wd calipers are a different style and are not compatible with the Zs. Sorry for the misinformation.

If you've ever wondered if your headlamps are working well or bright enough, maybe it's just that your Zs headlamps aren't aimed correctly. Headlamp misalignment is actually quite common on many cars and trucks on the road. At one time, your headlamps were aimed correctly from

the factory but due to some headlamp bulb changes or a fender bender or a change in your suspension, the alignment was changed. So read on and get your headlamps set right and have a safer ride! Also if your lamps are old incandescent types, upgrade to a Halogen type for a major improvement.

There are two ways to align your headlamps. One way is to bring it to a shop that has the headlight aiming tools and pay them to do it (this is the most accurate aiming.) It isn't that expensive but it also isn't difficult to do yourself. If you changed your headlamps to the "European" style that doesn't have the alignment pads on the bulbs, most shops won't be able to aim them. There are a few shops that have the ability to aim "European" style headlamps but they are more costly to aim.

Bring this article with you when you aim your headlamps. Note the following conditions. Gas tank should be filled to about halfway to compensate for the weight of the fuel. It is important to have the car loaded as it normally get used which includes the driver, any speaker boxes, tool boxes, etc. Anything you normally have in your Z, leave in your Z. Also check and adjust the tire pressures if needed. Bring a Phillips screwdriver, tape measure, and some 3/4" masking tape and a flashlight.

The numbers I've used here are directly from the Nissan factory manuals and Haynes manual for '70-'78 and should work for the Zs up to 1989. The '90s and up have their own special aimers in the rear hatch area.

1. Place the car on level ground directly square and head on to a wall so that the center of your headlamps are 33 feet from the wall. I found that many grocery stores have walls suitable for this.

> 2. Measure the height from the center of your headlamps to the ground. Place a line of tape horizontally in front of the Z on the wall wider than the car at the height you previously measured.

3. Place a vertical piece of masking tape directly on the wall in front of your Z (should be exactly centered in front of and vertical.) Measure the distance from the center of your headlamps to the middle of your Z. With these two measurements, mark off two more vertical lines of masking tape for center of the left and right headlamps.

4. Turn the headlamps on high beam and adjust the vertical and horizontal screws (there are cutouts in the headlamp doors where the screws are.) The TOP of the high beam should be level with the horizontal tape and the patterns centered onto each vertical tape (left and right.) Now once the high beams are set, the low beams should be aimed

The procedure in the Haynes manual says this type of adjustment is a temporary measure and the Nissan manual doesn't say this and gives info for vertical aiming. I feel the adjustment procedures above should suffice for most Z owners.

Electrical Troubleshooting Experience

Headlamp Adjustment

Made Easy

This is for all of us that have has problems with the ignition on the '79 to '83 280ZX.

Out of the blue my '79 started running rough.

• The engine would run fine and then

· The tach started to jump around when RPM was above 2500RPM and the engine would run rough.

When I came to stop at a light or stop sign it would die.
It also started to die on the road at 60 to 70MPH.
The engine would always restart fine.

• This all happened in one day and took two to trace down.

• I changed out the ignition module. No Go.

• I changed our the distributor cap and rotor. They needed it. No


• I changed the coil. No Go

• I was about to change the ECU. The '79 has a one board ECU and the '80 has a two board ECU. I held off.
• I thought..... I thought a lot.


The tach has nothing to do with the ECU, only the distributor and ignition module are involved. The engine management system and the tach get their primary timing from the distributor. I swapped the distributor from the '80 into the '79 and it came

The key to the problem was the tach. If the tach had just quit and dropped to zero, then it would have pointed to the ignition module. No output from the module, no input to the coil or the tach. What I didn't understand was the tach was only following the pulses from the distributor and they were going all over the place. The same for the coil. The coil didn't stop firing. It just fired RANDOMLY and this was the missing sound I heard in the engine.

I want to thank Lee from All Z Wrecking. He had all the parts and even helped trouble shoot the problem. I still have to get a distributor from him next week so I can put the '80 distributor back where it belongs. Evan

Tech Tip

If you own a 1984-88 300ZX, then you may now have old weak hood support struts. After time, these struts leak out the high pressure gas that gave them the strength to support your hood in the open position. Here's a fix that works, it's easy to fabricate and is very inexpensive. Take a piece of 1/2" PVC pipe (sprinkler pipe) and cut it to the length of the shaft of the hood strut when the hood is open, this should be 5". Then cut a lengthwise section out of the pipe; this section should be slightly wider than the shaft of the hood strut. The finished support "wedge" should now slip over the hood support strut shaft and keep your hood up.



Labor Day weekend (Aug 30,31 & Sept 1, 1997) When:

Boreal Ski Area, approx 10 miles west of Truckee, Where: CA (near Donner Summit on Interstate 80).

Who May Enter: Any automobile enthusiast is welcome to participate in the Sports Car Olympics. No club membership is required nor is any prior experience required to participate in the various events.

Equipment: Any type of automobile is welcome. All automobiles must be equipped with an adequate muffler and D.O.T.-approved street tires, and must pass a safety check at Boreal. Seat belts and helmets are required to compete in the two autocrosses (some loaner helmets will be available). Two person per automobile are required to compete in the Funkhana. The use of rally computers will not be allowed on the rally to the Ridge.

Schedule: Early Saturday morning, the Sports Car Olympics begins just east of Sacramento with the Rally to the Ridge. Saturday afternoon, following registration and the vehicle safety inspection at Boreal, the Concours d'Elegance will be held in the parking lot near the ski lodge. The day's competition concludes Saturday evening with the Sports Car Quiz. Sunday's schedule includes the first of two supportesses on the buge parking lot at Boreal, the autocrosses on the huge parking lot at Boreal, the Funkhana, and the Rally at the Ridge. The weekend concludes Monday morning with the second autocross followed by the awards banquet.


Entry Fee: A single entry fee covers all seven events and six catered meals at Boreal. Up until August 1, 1997, the entry fee is \$95 per person; after August 1st, the entry fee is \$105 per person. Entries should be mailed to the Sports Car Olympics, P.O. Box 444, Fremont, CA 94537-0444.

CA smog law update

The California State Legislature is currently processing SB-42, a bill which proposes to exempt all vehicles 25 model years old and older from the state smog check program. It passed overwhelmingly in the State Senate, and is now being run through the wringer in the Assembly.

The last action on this bill was its placement on the Ca Assembly's Appropriations Committee's Suspense list. This is customary for bills with a certain fiscal impact (I think it's \$500,000, but I'm not sure). Basically, it sat on that list for a month while the legislature dealt with more critical matters.

There is a hearing on this bill scheduled for AUGUST 29. Those of you who've been following SB-42 know that scheduled doesn't necessarily mean much, so we'll have to see what happens.

Remember, even though your car may not be 25 years old yet, it will be eventually. This isn't a bill to benefit just '72 and older cars, but ALL vehicles, at some time. If you've got a '78 280, and you don't want to see it confiscated by "the man", talk to these people.

As far as the fiscal impact goes, I've proposed that the lost smog-cert fees be added to exempted vehicles registration fees. As near as I can tell, if they tack the \$4/year onto ALL exempt vehicles (pre '66, diesels), the state could actually make money.

There's loads of popular support for this bill, but just about all the legislative analysis I've read is VERY critical of SB-42. Our voice does make a very definate difference.
