

TECH ARTICLES

eveloping suspension systems and tuning them is one area on Zs I like discussing with others whenever I can. I know that making a car go faster in a straight line returns immediate fun but if you come up to a corner and can't put the power to the ground, you are in for a surprise. If you improve the engine and the brakes, then the suspension needs to be improved

I like to included the following items all together as all these items effect one another in various ways. Tires, springs, shocks/struts, anti-sway bars, bushings, and camber/caster adjusters along with proper alignment settings make up the total suspension package.

The tires are the first and most significant improvement in the suspension chain. Getting more rubber in contact with the ground nets improved cornering speed. Wider is usually better but other things need to be taken into consideration too. The tire and wheel combination needs to be of the correct width, size and offset. The tires need to fit into the wheel wells and not rub anything during any normal driving condition. Normally a "0" offset wheel with a 6"-8" width works and tires from 195mm to 225mm width can work on Zs '89 and older. The width of tire used all depends on whether you use a 14", 15", 16", or 17" diameter wheel. My experience has shown me that the 15" and 16" wheels in widths between 6"-7" offer the best fit and availability of tires for the 1983 and older Zs. Good tire sizes are 215/60/14, 205/60/15, 225/50/15, 225/50/16. The later Zs from 1984 and up can use the 16" or 17" without problems. If your Z came with 16" and you wish to upgrade, opt for the 17" with a lower profile tire to improve steering response. But on the other hand, 17" tires are quite costly so I suppose it's really a matter of preference on the 1990 and up 300s.

In selecting springs, shocks/struts, and sway bars for your Z, you have to do some research to figure out what is best for you. There are many suspension component companies out there making kits from a street driven Z to a fully prepared road racing Z.

Bushings are usually made from urethane these days but other materials like Delrin and aluminum still get used. Changing from rubber to the harder urethane type bushings helps keep the suspension parts from deflecting during hard cornering resulting in a more precise feel and more stable alignment settings. The trade off for the hard bushings is more road noise and generally a stiffer ride all around. Some bushings like tension rod bushings and sway bar bushings make an improvement and don't change the ride quality noticeably.

Camber/caster adjusters allow suspension alignment settings to be changed that previously couldn't be done. Increasing the front and rear camber to a more negative setting than stock can improve overall cornering and turn in. Changing and adding in more caster allow the steering wheel to turn back faster after a turn but there are other things that come into play with that.

With all the changes that can be done, the first and simplest thing is getting wider tires and wheels. Note, just wider tires alone aren't enough. For the best handling, get lighter aluminum wheels and a name brand high performance tire. We are driving sports

cars aren't we so why buy cheap, no name tires? To save from confusion, buy a suspension system upgrade with Tokico gas shoks (regular or adjustable,) or KYB gas shocks, a matched set of springs and a matched set of sway bars. All those items combined, make your Z the most fun and

safer to drive. The other things I mentioned are for those who want to "dial" in your suspension to get the ultimate handling. There are a lot of good books out there on suspension so I won't elaborate any more on this subject. If you really want to know, buy some of those books like "How to Make Your Car Handle" by Fred Puhn and other more recent books.

For the benefit of suspension tuning, see the accompanying chart that shows how changes within the suspension system causes changes in the overall handling characteristics. Ultimately, neutral or neutral steer is the most desirable effect to achieve while taking a corner. If your Z had this then you could have the most control of the car by being able to induce oversteer with a little throttle lift (weight transfers to the front while rear gets light and loose,) or induce understeer with a little more throttle (weight transfers to the rear and the front gets lighter and pushes.)

So for more discussion let's see some questions come back to the editor and we can publish them for everyone to benefit. Happy motoring.

POCKET GUIDE TO HIGH PERFORMANCE HANDLING.

The keys to high performance handling are a top quality suspension system, proper chassis adjustments and properly balanced tire pressures. Aim for the theoretical ideal - **Neutral steer**: matched front and rear traction. **Understeer** is a plowing or pushing effect when cornering; **Oversteer** is the rear sliding outward on turns.



ow does the superb handling of a combined with American V8 grunt sound to you? That's what attracted Kirk Svalstad, ZCSD member #106, to modifying early generation Z cars. It



was only recently that Kirk got interested in early generation Zs.

It all started when his dad bought a book two years ago by Mac Knell, Datsun V8 Z Conversion Manual. After reading this book from cover to cover Kirk was convinced that this was the ultimate "sleeper". He began his project by purchasing a 1978 280Z. This original purchase was a learning project. Kirk fully restored the 1978 Z over a

> substantial period of time to learn all the details to come when building his V8 monster. During his restoration, Kirk learned that the Z is a perfect platform for more horsepower and torque given its lightweight and nimbleness.

After about a year of prepping, Kirk sold his '78 for a '77 280Z where his project leads to today. At first glance, you would never think Kirk's Z is more than "another restored 280". The exterior remains stock except for a lowered stance and a set of after market wheels. When asked about his Z, Kirk will inform you that it is painted "Polar Porsche" (silver) with a very exceptionally restored black interior.

Since Kirk is an Engineering major at San Diego State University, you can bet that the attention to detail is there. When the key turns, a low level rumble is felt and heard. This bass-like mote makes your head turn and the brain inside it baffle by the V8 grunt this Japanese car is churning out. Kirk has somehow managed to rewire his vehicle to

accept a Chevy V8 motor in the engine bay with plenty of room left over. It doesn't stop there though. To make his modification complete, Kirk added a Tilton master cylinder, a



Camaro transmission and clutch all linked to the almighty R200 Nissan rear end. According to Kirk, he believes that the stock rearend can handle up to 400+ pound/feet of torque.

When I asked for a ride, Kirk was intimidated that I drive a modified and nitrous assisted Twin Turbo ZX. But let me reassure the fans of older Zs that Kirk's sleeper will give me a run for the money at stop light confrontations. It is apparent that for around eight thousand bucks, good old elbow grease, a piece of American V8 muscle, and some time and patience - everyone can own a "Japanese Heartbeat of America". While I search out for an older 240 or 280Z to build in Kirk's fashion, he will be watching modern fuel injected vehicles as a blur in his rear view mirror! Michael

Mr. Katayama Inducted into the **Automotive Hall of Fame**

ur favorite "Man in Japan", Mr. Katayama, has been elected to the Automotive Hall of Fame in Dearborn, Michigan! Hall of Fame Induction, the highest honor bestowed, is reserved for individuals who have made significant impact, contributions and historical change to automotive products, concepts or processes. Selections are made by the Hall of Fame Board or Directors following extensive research and recommendations from an advisory panel of automotive historians and editors, and the Hall of Fame Awards Committee.

In the "1998 Automotive Hall of Fame Inductees" release I received from the AHF this afternoon, the Hall of Fame says this about "our" Mr. K:



Yutaka Katayama

A sales-oriented visionary, Yutaka Katayama is the automotive pioneer behind Nissan's success in the Untied States. In spite of great adversity, Katayama is credited with selling a product in a market that was reluctant to buy or consider imported cars. He started by carefully tracking changes in the U.S. market, and promoted cars and trucks that he felt Americans wanted. The Datsun 510 or 1968 was a pacemaker - a small durable four-door sedan that sold for approximately \$1,800--a price within reach of many car buyers. In 1970, Katayama introduced the popular Datsun 240Z, continued on page 6

and then launched the first small pickup truck in the U.S. Known as "Mr. K," Katayama used his people skills and sales ability to establish a vast network of dealers. He also built technical schools to teach dealers and their mechanic the benefits of superior service. Katayama retired in 1977 at the age of 68 and resides in Japan.

Although in a new facility, the Automotive Hall of Fame was founded nearly 60 years ago in October 1939 to preserve the history of motor vehicle pioneers. In those six decades, 155 individuals have been inducted into the Hall of Fame. At an October 13, 1998 Induction Ceremony in Dearborn, Mr. Katayama will be honored and his achievements will be recognized.

This gala will be an "admission by invitation only" event. Information on the procedure to request your name be added to this invitation list will be made available for release at the Fiesta de Albuquerque 11th Annual Z-Car Convention in July.

Along with Mr. Katayama, other 1998 Inductees are to include: Andre Citroen, Charles M. Pigott, Fred M. Zeder, Count Ferdinand von Zeppelin, and the five Opel brothers, Carl, Wilhelm, Heinrich and Ludwig. Of the 1998 inductees, all except Yutaka Katayama and Charles M. Pigott are deceased.

Mr. Katayama will be our Honored Guest at the 11th Annual Z-Car Convention, July 20th-25th. Don't miss the opportunity to meet the "Father of the Z-Car." Mr. K is truly a remarkable human being and we are very proud that he will soon be "officially" honored for his automotive accomplishments.

Tech Tips

Manual transmission tips:

When driving, don't hold or rest your hand on the shifter of a manual transmissioned car. The weight or pressure pushes the shift forks against the slider and wears out those parts faster. It's best to use your arm rest not

S ince reverse isn't a syncrhonized gear like the forward gears are, going from neutral straight to reverse may occasionally grind or clunk. To avoid the "clunk" or grinding sound when going into reverse from neutral, first shift into a forward gear like either 5th or 3rd.

Toyota 4 piston caliper conversion:

If you have installed the Toyota 4 piston caliper conversion, make sure the spring that spreads the pads is installed on the bottom of the pads not the top. If installed on the top, the pads will grab the rotor and make a clicking sound as well as squeel. I've experienced this but moved the spring and all the problems were fixed.
