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



TECH ARTICLE

Flywheels and Clutches But were afraid to ask

or this month's tech article, I will touch on two areas of performance often forgotten by the average Z owner. A lighter flywheel and the installation of a stronger clutch set-up can help improve your Z's performance. Only manual transmission Zs have flywheels and clutches, so you with automatics can read but none of this applies to you. The flywheel is a rotating plate that is attached to the back of the crankshaft by bolts. What does it do? It provides inertial storage and holds the starter gear and the clutch assembly. The clutch disc friction material makes contact on the flywheel as you let the clutch pedal out to get the car moving.

The reason Nissan chose the weight of the stock flywheel as it is, was to come to a compromise between ease of clutch engagement without stalling the engine and at the same time not being a boat anchor (heavier than needed.) When the flywheel on the engine is lighter than stock, it allows the engine to accelerate and decelerate much more rapidly. The benefit to this is a Z that accelerates more quickly and has crisper throttle response (which is great for back roads and autocrossing.) Another benefit is turbo Zs gain boost sooner with lighter flywheels. The only drawbacks might be in real heavy stop and go traffic, parking lots or on a steep hill. A little

more rpm will be needed to get the car moving from a stop. With a lighter flywheel, it doesn't take long to make the adjustment to its new weight and the performance is noticed immediately.

There are many ways to get a lighter flywheel.

One way is to remove material from the backside (block side,) of the flywheel. I've seen this done before but it must be done properly. Generally 5-10 pounds can safely be taken off and total end weight should not be less than 17-18 pounds. Early 240Zs and 1984-89 non-turbo 300s have fairly light flywheels so not much can be removed from them.

Another way to lighten the flywheel is to purchase a custom made light flywheel. Most custom flywheels are 11-14 pounds while stock flywheels are 19-35 pounds depending on the model. The last choice is probably the best as you get a light flywheel that is very strong and it bolts to the stock location. Custom flywheels are usually made of either aluminum with a hardened steel insert, ductile iron, or chromoly. The advantage of the aluminum flywheel is that the weight of the hardened insert is more toward the center rotation and that helps keep the inertial rotating weight down. The chromoly and ductile iron flywheels are the solid material all throughout like a cast iron flywheel.

Years ago, I used stock clutch replacements on one of my Datsuns. At that time as I made more upgrades, I found that I would break my clutch more easily. I was rough on equipment then (drag racing.) Later, I invested in a heavier duty clutch and my problems were gone. The 2 seater Zs from 1970-1983 used a 225mm diameter clutch disc. The 2+2s from 1974-1983 and 1982-83 280ZX Turbos all use a 240mm diameter disc. If you put the 2+2 or turbo flywheel with the 240mm disc onto a 2 seater Z, then you can use the larger disc which in effect gives you a heavy duty clutch. What you are looking for if you buy a performance clutch, is higher clamping force without significantly higher clutch pedal pressure. You also want to stay away from discs that have metal facings (especially the ceramic puck styles or button discs,) and opt for the organic facing if you use your Z primarily on the street. Metal disc materials can chatter and grab making them a chore to use in city traffic. There are other new materials on the market like carbon-kevlar. These work better when they are hot which makes them better for racing but when they are cold, chattering or rough engagement is likely.



Mr. J. from La Jolla steps into automaker's ad spotlight

Los Angeles – Goodbye, Mr. K. Hello, Mr. J. Needing a bridge between its March deal-of-the-week ads and its expansive launch of products that begins in June, Nissan is using Jerry Hirshberg, president of Nissan Design International in La Jolla, as its advertising messenger. No Mystical old Japanese man. No perky terriers. Just Jerry and the sheet metal. "Enjoy the Ride" has been replaced by the bolder slogan, "Driven."

A Three-month run of TV commercials in rotation will feature Hirshberg, clearly identified as Nissan's chief designer, describing product attributes and design decisions Nissan used in making its vehicles.

The first ads hit Monday, May 31, and are split evenly between existing products and teasers for the upcoming Xterra, Maxima and Frontier Crew Cab.

The use of Hirshberg was not and easy decision, says Mike Seergy, Nissan Division's general manager. Realizing the auto industry is an insular business, Seergy was worried that Hirshberg's growing status at Nissan might not carry over into the secular realm.

So, Nissan ran test footage of Hirshberg past focus groups – with surprising results.

"Jerry reeks of credibility and genuineness. He's not your typical corporate executive. You can't script him, "Seergy says. "Jerry completely drew the focus groups into the products, about what Nissan is all about."

Seergy feels bringing a designer's perspective into the ads will make people understand where Nissan products come from.

"No other company talks about how and why their cars are a certain way. People think cars just come out of a factory somewhere. People need to know why a car is so special that they should buy it. And Jerry explains all that, "Seergy says.

The hope is that the Hishberg ads will bring a new enthusiasm about Nissan to consumers, who have been pelted by pricing ads from Nissan this year and by whimsical but muddled messages from the Mr. K brand campaign before that.

Having Hirshberg deflect attention to Nissan products, and away from price, will bring a natural link to the launch ads that start in late lune.

The launch ads will have a confident tone, "Hopefully just short of arrogance," Seergy says.

The initial launch ads will begin with Hirshberg talking, but quickly switch to product-only sports. Hirshberg will reappear later in the year for the Altima face lift and Sentra redesign.

Another concern for Seergy was in keeping the message the same in the national, regional and dealer advertising.

"National is 'Buy Nissan,' regional is 'Buy Nissan now,' and local is 'Buy Nissan here,'" Seergy says. "But you're not going to be hearing about any cash-back deals."

Member Profile

hat can you say about a guy who doesn't follow the norm?
Of course, this may be a prerequisite if you live in Southern
California. Al Peterson, his wife, Cindy, and their two children,
have lived in San Diego most of their lives. Previously owning a "normal"
1972 240Z he bought in 1987, Al finally decided he wanted something
different. Something that would satisfy his craving for driving very fast
around a race course and still be able to drive it to work on Monday.
Well, I could go on about our Competition Coordinator, but I'm going to
let him tell you about his project – after all, it helps when you're a
Mechanical Engineer. - ed

This project started out like many other projects, to build something that was a little different from all the other cars out they're on the road. I finally decided on the GTO rebody kit from Blue Ray Engineering in Texas, to provide the fiberglass body panels. Then, I needed a nice Z car to use as the starting point for this project.... I found a low mileage (89,000 miles) '71 240Z that had been stored for at least 10 years in Santee, I bought it and drove it for a couple weeks before completely taking it apart.

It took about 6 months to strip the body and graft on the new body onto the 240Z and prep it for paint. The next phase of the project was to drop in a small block 350 ci. were the 6 cylinder once resided. I had talked to a lot of people about the merits of 6 cylinder "vs" small block, and decided that when it comes to cubic inches...more is better. So I built a 350 with aluminum head (to save weight) and all the other go-fast parts for it. The motor was mated to a Borg-Warner T-5 5 speed. The installation was not very difficult, I used the book Jaguar's that Run as a resource. It was extremely helpful. The rear end was upgraded to an R-200, and I just recently upgraded to Limited Slip unit to aid in traction.

The suspension has been upgraded to Eibach springs and Tokico 5 way adjustable struts. All the bushings have been replaced with urethane and strut bars brace the strut towers front and rear. An Autopower full rollcage was install to protect occupants in the off chance of an off road detour. The interior has been fitted with a custom seats / upholstery and a custom wooded dash insert.

Now that the GTO is running (projects are never finished!!!), I have taken to a few car shows. Which is fun, but I really like taking the GTO for some autocrossing and going out to Holtville. This is when you find out what the car and driver needs to go fast. I just complete the addition of rear disc brake from a 300ZX to replace the old drum brakes and I planning to add power steering this summer, this should help my autocross times this fall. Stay tuned in for future changes......





NISSAN NOOZ

Nissan confirms it will bring out a sporty Z coupe in 2002 as a 2003 model but said that car won't resemble the concept Z on this year's autoshow circuit.

Jerry Hirshberg, president of Nissan design, concedes that consumer reaction to the Z proved people wanted a production model, only many didn't like the design of the concept, especially the Porsche-like rear end and too low-slung roof line.

"We did the concept in four weeks to learn if it was a good idea. We learned it was a risk, but seemed justified to help restore a tarnished image," Hirshberg says.

"After listening to folks on the auto-show circuit, we'll refine it and will work on the real Z – headlamps, tail lamps, proportions and dimensions. The car is evolving as we speak."

"We're looking at a couple of engines and haven't ruled out a six. It might be done on a new platform and may have a French accent," he says, alluding to Renault.

"It has to be an exciting car, but not a muscle car. It has to have speed and performance, but be in the mid-\$20,000 range. It probably will be a rear-wheel-drive car. And (noting the low rook line) someone 6 feet 4 has got to be able to get inside. We have three years to do it right."



TECH ARTICLE

The latest trend in racing discs are using discs with an unsprung hub. These types of discs are the ultimate in grip for drag racing due to the lack of hub springs and instant engagement. The problem with them is that they engage so well that the shock of the engagement often breaks parts like transmissions and driveshafts. I recommend avoiding any disc that doesn't use hub springs as they should be used to cushion the engagement. Performance clutches and light flywheels can be purchased from speed shops that sell Nissan performance parts. Next time you need to replace your clutch, think about what was said here and make the upgrade.
