



As a young child I loved going fast. Growing up I found the steepest hills to ride my bicycle and skateboard down. At the age of 8 my dad bought us kids a Honda Trail 70 motorbike. It's a shame I don't still have that. I saw one sell for \$4800.00 just recently. It had a 3 speed with no clutch and learning to ride it I wasn't allowed past 2nd gear. That didn't last too long, though. At the age of 9 my dad got me a Suzuki CCI 90 dirt bike. I rode this as fast as I could. I had accidents, but for some reason, God watched over my recklessness, and I continued to push for faster trails and paths.

I couldn't wait to get my driver's license. At the age of 4, dad bought us a purple pedal car. My little sister and I did the nuttiest stuff in this little car. The hills we pushed it down, with her in it most of the time I think, should have killed both of us, but once again, God looked after his idiots. My dad got me a car a couple months before I got my learner's permit. He wanted to teach me responsibility with vehicles and finances. I'm not sure that worked out like he thought it would. I got my Driver's license the day I turned 16 because my dad was willing to drive me several counties over to where the examiner was giving the driving tests.

Over the years I've ridden motorcycles, which are crazy fast compared to the cars I've had, including the Z. They filled my need for speed and always gave me that rush off the line acceleration. I've gotten to watch the Formula 1 race in Long Beach several years ago. I would rather be in the vehicle in place of watching from the sidelines.



Last year I got to drive a Lamborghini Huracan around the Sonoma racetrack. Before I drove the Lambo, I warmed up taking laps in a Charger Hellcat riding with a professional driver.





At the end of the year, I got to go to Willow Springs with Dennis Darnall. Dennis took his '75ish 280Z on a trailer to Willow Springs "Streets" track and allowed me to go with him. All I can say is I have a new goal in life.



The day at the track was incredible. His car is immaculate! The outfit that allows track enthusiasts to do this is called Speed District at Speeddistrict.com. We spent the whole day at the track and Dennis got to race once an hour for 20 minutes per hour from 8am to about 4pm. Lots and lots of track time. It's my goal to get my car ready and be able to afford to do this.

One of my inspirations is Paul Newman. He started racing later in life, around the age of 45. He raced into his 80's stating that he would stop "when he embarrassed himself". He drove Z cars from the early 70's to the late 80's with a pretty good winning record. He won several SCCA sanctioned events. It says to me that it's never too late. I will say he probably had more resources than most with his acting career being able to sponsor his racing career a bit.

April 20-21 SCCA Autocross will be held at NICU Amphitheatre in Chula Vista. This is the 1st time I've been close enough to do anything like this, and I plan to go even if I can't participate. I'm going to try to participate though.



This month at the April 2nd meeting we'll be talking about track things. Dennis will talk a little about it and what it takes to track at those events.

I'm curious how many club members have the desire to track their car? Newman started a bit earlier in life than I have, but there are still plenty of years left for me to try. I have no idea how I will do on a track, but I still would really like to try and see what it's like.
