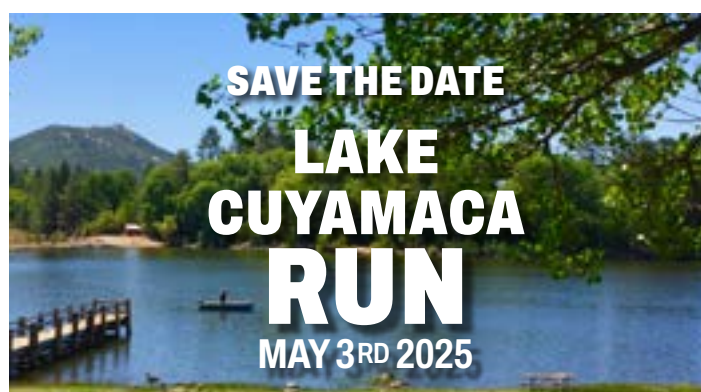

Lake Cuyamaca is a recreation area operated by the Lake Cuyamaca Recreation and Park District and the Helix Water District. It offers boating, fishing, picnicking, birdwatching, hiking, wedding and party venues, cabin rentals and camping. A store, restaurant, pub, and tackle shop are onsite, as well as boat rentals.

The reservoir is stocked with over 38,000 lbs. of trout annually, and is the only San Diego lake that is able to stock trout all year long. Other species of fish include Florida bass, smallmouth bass, channel catfish, crappie, bluegill and sturgeon.

Desert “No” Flower Run

Saturday was my break day. My wife was recovering from surgery, and my wonderful mother-in-law was going to be with her. I had spent Wednesday night and Thursday night in the hospital next to her on what I believe was a torture device couch. It was slightly inclined to make you feel as if you were sliding off and I've sat on more comfortable stone benches than this couch. My poor wife had it much worse as this was an emergency surgery and no one is prepared for that. (She is doing much better and is on the mend.) But this was an event I wasn't sure I was going to be able to make. I'm very glad I did!

First thing I needed to do was start my car. I had washed her the weekend before but hadn't filled it up yet. My beautiful baby started up 1st try with no problems so that was a positive. It was sunny out so of course, even though it was only 60 degrees



outside, the top was put down. There was little traffic on the way up to Ramona. I even got to go up Poway Road to the 67 without any slow cars in front of me. That was special all in itself. Stopping for gas in Ramona was easy enough. Ramona was one of the 1st places I had ever filled my 370Z up after I first got it. It was when gas was soaring after Covid times and man was that a shock. My car holds 19 gallons of premium fuel and at \$5.90 a gallon, well, you can imagine.

On up the hill to Dudley's bakery where we were meeting wasn't as nice a drive due to the cars on the road. It seemed no one

wanted to do the speed limit, or even close. It was, however, a gorgeous day outside and that allowed me to view the scenery as it passed as well as enjoy the engine thrum.

At Dudley's pulling into the parking lot there were already 3 cars there. One was a beautiful Z33 Roadster in metallic blue. It was beautiful with the top down, of course! I parked next to them and that put an S30, a Z32, a Z33 and a Z34 together to start the day off. 2 Roadsters! How awesome! Ron Heintskill came out to say hi and tell me about the other cars there. It is always good to see him and his wife Judy. I met the other Z owners inside. They had come down from Inland Valley. I met John Harris, the owner of the 350Z Roadster, and Mike Rivers who had a beautiful 240Z. I met a few other Z owners, A.J. Novack, and Michael Capuano. It was awesome meeting up with the neighboring club, ZCCIV (Z Car Club of Inland Valley), and getting to see their rides. It was such a beautiful day to get out!



I have only led one other event. I had driven the route before and knew what turns and where I was going. I did this one off a map. I had been on the road before but didn't know exactly where we would end up and when. There were also, I thought at the time, about 18 cars. Turns out that not all of the ZCCIV came with us but a few of them did. We actually had 3 new Zs with us on this run, one of them owned by our very own new newsletter editor and his wife, Craig and Nancy. I had asked Clif to follow behind me in case I took any wrong turns he could lead until I had righted myself. This was going to be a new experience for me.

When the last person showed up, around 11:30, we had our driver's meeting and mounted up and took off down the 79. We turned on San Felipe Road and we were off. When we turned

on Montezuma Valley road, being in the lead, I took off. I wanted to make as much space as I could so that everyone that wanted could open their Zs as each driver felt led. Rob Johnson, with his wife Kim riding shotgun, kept up with me the whole way. I passed a very slow red Honda Fit and an equally slow Jeep that didn't understand what the turnouts were for, even though they had 15 cars right behind them. Everyone made their merry way down the mountain. I could see Clif and Carlton in their Z32s also keeping pace. We were going to turn off at the Montezuma Valley Lookout but I didn't think there would be enough parking for all the cars so I went all the way to the bottom and turned into Borrego Springs.

We stopped for a break at Christmas Circle and allowed everyone to catch their breath after screaming "Coming Down the Mountain When She Comes", or whatever everyone did to enjoy the twistys. I don't have a good singing voice, but I did hear some good tunes heading down the mountain, Don Henley's "Boys of Summer" and others. I didn't sing any of them, but I let my engine and gear box do some harmony. At the break, Kim told me she enjoyed the spirited run down the hill but if Rob got too close to the cliffside he would absolutely be in trouble.

We went up to a desert flower viewing area and but all we saw was dirt. I don't know if any of the flowers were in bloom but when I had planned this event I tried to pick a spot that would be a high percentage of possibility of seeing some desert blooms, but no luck on this outing. Dennis saw the dirt and no signs of color in the fields of sand and turned around and saved us a spot at Christmas Circle for our picnic.

We all headed back and pulled out our chairs and picnic baskets and sat under a beautiful shade tree. It was only about 80 degrees out and a few little clouds in the sky and we sat and ate our lunch sharing stories and catching up with one another. I was glad Ralph Carwin had been able to break away from work and get his '72 green 240Z out. He got to come with us but he had to head back a little early to get back to work. A few others left from there, not wanting to see the Iron Statues by Ricardo Breceda.

One of the stories I'll share is the one where Rob Johnson accused my car of being an automatic. He said that my car didn't sound like a manual transmission because it shifted too smoothly. I absolutely corrected him to let him know my car's proper place in sports car lineage. It's also the reason my car isn't a daily driver. I have been caught several times in traffic since I bought my 370Z a few years ago. But I want it to be my choice when to use all four limbs when I drive.

After lunch, I lead the remaining adventurers out to the statues and turned off the road as soon as I saw examples of the work. There was an elephant and camels and giant tortoises. We also saw down the line a giant scorpion and cricket. I asked Clif to lead since he knew where most of the statues were, and we traveled further down the road to see some dinosaurs and dragons. It was a really neat experience.

The drive home was also spirited because I didn't have to lead anyone. Last year on another run I came out of Borrego reversing the route we took down Montezuma Valley and I watched my oil temperature get very hot. This year with an oil cooler and



having my AC recharged recently I wanted to see how hot it got. It still got to 230F, but stayed there and didn't climb any higher.

I made it home to take over caring for my beautiful wife and letting my wonderful mother-in-law head home at a reasonable time of day. It was an awesome break day!

Thanks ZCSD for being the wonderful excuse you are when we have those days that we need a break!
