The next morning, Todd Wills continued the story in the club newsletter with our trip on the Fourth of July to Casa Grande, near Phoenix.



ESCONDIDO - The Z American Relay made a brief pit stop at the Escondido Auto Park Tuesday morning before heading on to Arizona.


The stopover was part of an 11-week road relay that began May 13, in which Nissan "Z" car drivers crisscross the U.S. in a Z-shaped route to celebrate the "Z" car's 25th anni-

versary.
"Z" clubs across the country have joined the fund-raising, weekend-only event. Each San Diego Z Club driver who participates is sponsored for 1 cent per mile, and all proceeds are donated to the Make-a-Wish Foundation of San Diego. The Nissan Corp. has donated \$2,500 to Make-a-Wish foundation in each of the nine regions taking part in the relay.

Last month's Fun Stuff ...

WHAT A MONTH !!!!! The back country tour with Group Z, the Z Across America Relay and the tour thru Palomar Observatory !!! Can't get a whole lot busier than that. The Back Country Tourcan't tell you much about it 'cause I had prior commitments that day. Come to the meeting and find out!!

The Z Across America Relay I can tell you about. Wish you were there, glad if you were there!! I'll pick up where Clif left off (see Clif's Notes On ...). The schedule said to meet at San Diego Nissan at 10:30 for photo and TV coverage. Not wanting to be late I set my CB to channel 24 and timed my trip to hopefully meet the rest of the Club on the route from Escondido to Mission Valley. I arrived at a San Diego Nissan dealership that was dark and parked alone on the street. After about ten minutes two more Z's showed up, we chatted; it seems they were there for the same reason I was. Then another, then another, and about 45 minutes later the whole Club showed up being led by a red 300ZX Twin Turbo SMZ 25th Anniversary Special. Except that the dealership was closed on the alleged busiest car selling day of the year, all was good. Over the next hour I was to learn the meaning of "lets see some energy". Waivers signed, pictures taken, greetings exchanged and radios checked we pointed the long line of beautiful Z Cars east on route 8 toward the mountains - 22 Z's in a line is a beautiful sight. After a pit stop in Alpine, Clif and I had to play catch-up with the rest of the cars; did you know that those magnetic CB mounts blow off somewhere around 90 mph? Twice. We caught everyone just as they were stopping for a rest stop at the Dessert Overlook Tower and - that's right, folks "lets see some energy". From 4500 feet (altitude) to 200 feet was an easy coast for the 12 Z's that "went all the way", but on the four hours of virtually straight (as in no curves) road to Phoenix the boredom was only relieved by the chatter and sometime good natured ribbing on the CB (is your little yellow thing hot, Dave?). We pulled into the Casa Grande Sizzler parking lot at 6:30 PM only to find out they were closing early because of the holiday. On to Chandler, where Dave Draper was to leave the SMZ. After a dinner at Appleby's mixed with lots of good conversation, we went to our motel rooms and most reported seeing the fireworks display. The next morning we met for breakfast, gassed up and caravaned to Bob Bondurant's School of High Performance Driving. We were met by one of Bob's staff who showed us a promotional video and gave us a tour of the maintenance area - easily as large as any of the large dealerships. We then piled into a fifteen passenger FORD van and were given a demonstration of the skidpad, accident avoidance and brake test areas of the complex - mixed with the Mustang GT's of students - by one of the instructors. THEN we got into OUR Z CARS and played pace & chase with a couple of Bondurant's instructors driving

Taurus SHO's. Bondurant has a road course that challenges students with any type of comer one might encounter - BOY WAS THAT FUN. Naturally, we all wanted to go faster, but the instructors are professionals and they limited the speed to what they thought was safe for all of us. After we parked our cars Bob Bondurant wanted some publicity photo's, and who showed up but Johnny O'Connel, one of NISSAN's top drivers of the Cunningham 300ZXT IMSA GTS team. after the picture session two instructors and Bob himself gave demonstrations to eager passengers of how to properly drive the course. They were faster than we were II could have gone faster, but that damn vellow Taurus was in front of me... besides, I have to pay for my tires, he gets his free from Goodyear... It's his track, he's used to it]. We then had a souvenir buying/autograph session in the Bondurant store and talked about how much fun it was to throw our cars around the road course. After the adrenalin wound down, pulses returned to normal and t-shirts were purchased we got some drive-thru lunch and headed back to San Diego. Six hours of driving, again chattering on the radios and we arrived tired, but very excited, back in San Diego. Problems? One car lost a mirror, an oil pressure question, a few warm engines and a burst heater hose, but no major problems. Are these great cars or what? The trip, over 750 miles, was survived by three new 300ZX, one 85 turbo, three 280ZX, two 280Z and three 240's - almost all of the cars were over ten years old. We got some neat momentos for participating in the rally - license plate frame, t-shirt, lapel pin, poster - and from Bondurant's - hat, lapel pin. bumper stickers, CART raceguide; but what we really received from the adventure was a camaraderie earned from sharing a fantastic experience and a chance to meet a legend of racing history.

#### RATTLESNAKE RUN

An appropriate name for a run across the southwest deserts of California and Arizona on the 4th of July. But as the president of the Z Club of San Diego I felt obligated to take up the gauntlet thrown down by Dave Draper and get our club excited about the Z America Relay.

We had 23 cars meet at 8:30 a.m. in Escondido Nissan's parking lot. This was Dave Draper's home town and we wanted a good showing. The owner was handing out juice and coffee, and everyone had several. We saddled up after Draper had taken more publicity photos than he'll ever use, and pulled out of the parking lot some 30 minutes behind schedule. Being July 4th, the traffic would be minimal, and we flashed down the freeway for San Diego 30 miles south.

We picked up another 5 cars and of course the scheduled 30 minute stop turned into an hour after Draper took 24 more publicity photos. Kodak should have sponsored this guy. We agreed on channel 24 for the CB equipped cars and rolled off down I-8 for the 357 remaining miles to Casa Grande, Arizona. A total of 12 cars passed over the summit of the Laguna Mountains and plunged into the 105 degree heat of California's Imperial Valley. All the while, drivers and their navigators were sipping on whatever they had that was wet and cold. Another photo opportunity at the Desert View Tower had eaten all the remaining spare time out of our schedule, so the rest stop in El Centro was waived, and we pressed on for Yuma.

How quickly can people eat and run at a McDonald's? We probably set the record trying to make up for lost time and get to Casa Grande on time. As we drove, the CB radios kept us in touch with the pace car, and as the hours zoomed by like so many cactus, I could only hope that the rest of the cars weren't about to mutiny for lack of a potty break. Finally, Draper said, "Clif, should we stop in Gila (pronounced Heela) Bend, or press on to Casa Grande?" (55 more miles) I said, "lets stop, but don't take the first exit, use the second." But as the sight of civilization loomed ahead, 2 cars exited and were never seen again. But at the second exit, Draper got confused and didn't turn off. Dutifully all the cars followed him and as I crossed my legs and screamed, we of the rattlesnake run continued. I guess I shouldn't have had that last liter bottle of Gatorade.

One last chance was a rest area marked on the Arizona highway map, but the sign at the exit read "CLOSED FOR REPAIR", we pressed on. We took the exit for the Maricopa Highway and our destination Casa Grande was only 10 miles down this road, through the Maricopa Indian Reservation. Tall saguaro cactus were now on each side of the road, the kind that look like a person with his arms held out and up. I guess Draper felt the same way I did, for suddenly the pace car swerved to the shoulder of the road and Dave made a mad dash for the privacy of the nearest cactus to answer natures call. Our caravan of 12 cars had hardly come to a complete stop when the first vehicle we spotted was the Maricopa Indian Reservation Tribal Security Patrol. They came to a tire squealing, dust cloud raising stop and leap from their Blazer. "Hold it right there mister!" I think at the time, Dave was holding it right there. "You're under arrest for desecrating sacred tribal land." We were all dumb founded. We tried to persuade the officers, but they said the deed had been done, and nothing short of a night in the Reservation's jail or a fine of \$250 dollars cash could resolve the issue. They drove him away in the blazer, and

I got to drive the pace car as we followed them to the Tribal Headquarters. Between us we had the \$250 dollars, so as they took their time shuffling the paperwork and finally removing the handcuffs, we had eaten up another hour and a half of precious time.

We completed the run to Cassia Grande, far off schedule, and most importantly, we were late for Dave's airplane connection back to San Diego. We hauled up the interstate toward Phoenix at over 90 mph. Unfortunately, we were not in time... Dave missed the last flight out of Phoenix, and the alternatives were grim. Does the thought of 8 hours on a Greyhound Bus sound like the perfect way to end 4 full days of cross country driving?

I guess the saying holds true. Take Greyhound, and leave the driving to us. Sorry Dave, we tried to get you there on time.
